Insurance Coverage

Senior Softball-USA is happy to include insurance coverage, offered by National Certified, Inc, as part of our 2010 package of products and services available to Clubs and Leagues.

The insurance coverage includes general liability and accident coverage for the parks you use, and all Clubs & Leagues (C&L) officials, participants, coaches, managers, volunteers and spectators.

All umpires are provided liability coverage. Paid umpires must be covered by an inexpensive accident policy. Accident coverage for unpaid umpires is provided under the umbrella policy.

Here is the coverage you receive:

Liability Coverage:

Most owners of fields – whether it is a city or a private owner – require that you carry an “additionally insured” liability policy on them and their facility. This is a liability policy that covers them in case of a lawsuit.

This liability policy also covers general liability claims against your club / league, its officials, participants, coaches, managers, volunteers, spectators and umpires.

The liability portion provides \$2 million each occurrence for personal injury and products, \$100,000 fire damage (per fire), with a \$0 deductible per claim.

Accident Medical Coverage:

The accident medical portion of your coverage (which is now required in order to get the liability protection) is designed as a secondary medical policy to cover major claims after the primary health policy benefits have been exhausted.

The accident medical portion covers all participants, coaches, managers, volunteers, spectators and unpaid umpires. The coverage includes

\$25,000 medical benefit per claim (with a \$2,500 deductible), \$5,000 accidental death / dismemberment per claim.

Paid Umpires:

Paid umpires receive up to \$25,000 in medical benefits per claim and \$5,000 in accidental death / dismemberment per claim.

Here is the cost:

- \$275 for field liability coverage for the year.
- \$20 per team registration for clubs & leagues (good for year).
- \$15 per team registration for recreational tournaments.
- \$35 per umpire (paid umpires only / good for year).

NOTE: The \$35.00 umpire registration fee is for a full registration and all umpires are encouraged to become fully registered. However if this is the only SSUSA event an umpire will work in 2008, and it entails a minimum amount of games worked, there is a limited registration fee of \$12.00 that will be accepted, with the approval of the SSUSA National UIC.

Here is what you need to send to Liz Zheng, Clubs & Leagues National Administrator:

- Send in a check for the field insurance and team registrations. Make the check payable to “SSUSA C&L.”
- Send in rosters of the teams plus a list of all volunteers, including unpaid umpires (we have to have the names on file in case of a claim, but the lists are kept confidential). The roster and list information should include each individual’s name, address, home phone and birth date. Also include each individual’s e-mail address if available.

3. Send in the address of the covered facility, the name and address of the owner of the facility, and fax numbers of the facility owner and yourself.

Umpire registration fees for paid umpires, accompanied by a completed SSUSA umpire's registration form (a printable blank version of the form is available on the SSUSA web site, www.seniorsoftball.com), should be sent to the SSUSA's national UIC Ray Starwalt, 2307 36th St SE, Puyallup, WA 98374. If you have any umpire questions, Ray Starwalt can be contacted at (W) 253-848-0068; (C) 253-208-2550; or (E) starwaltr@aol.com.

We will send you separate insurance binders for each field that is covered so that you have them available during tournament and/or league play. The separate binders will each list a name of a field that is covered.

Extras:

Under our insurance, you may use Miken Ultra II and Synergy bats plus all other bats meeting the original 1.21 bpf standard.

You can buy balls from SSUSA at a discount. We recommend men's balls of 375 compression (they can be 44, or 40 COR) and women's balls of 47COR and 525 Compression.

Umpires can buy rule books, uniforms and gear at a steep discount. Umpires paying the limited registration fee need only buy a green tee shirt and black hat for a uniform.

Please be advised that the licensed insurance agents brokering this product are National Certified, Inc employees. The SSUSA C&L directors, through utilization of the clubs and leagues regional network, simply make their constituents aware of the various SSUSA products and services available.

Administration Support Services

The SSUSA Clubs & Leagues program has a network of national, regional and state or metropolitan directors available to offer administrative assistance to your local club or league. Whether it is help with your league program, a local recreational tournament, the development of a recreational tournament circuit, etc., the SSUSA Clubs & Leagues program is there to offer help.

This is a tremendous resource that your club or league can draw on to help overcome obstacles you may encounter. The SSUSA Clubs & Leagues directors can offer an overview of your area, drawing on the SSUSA's extensive data base to provide contact information you may not possess, that can enable you to reach out to neighboring clubs and leagues to arrange recreational competitions outside of your own club / league sphere.

In addition some of the additional administrative tasks a director can perform, but is not limited to, include contacting the recreation department of the local community to make field arrangements, publicize the event locally or by utilizing the SSUSA's newspaper and web site, make arrangements for event insurance, provide game balls, arrange for umpires, establish a contact for event lodging, arrange for awards, etc.

A director's involvement can be that of a consultant or it can entail assuming the directorship of the entire event, it's your call. Your local director can draw on the cumulative knowledge and experience of the entire SSUSA Clubs & Leagues "team" to provide you answers and information regarding your current program and / or future endeavors.

To find the name and contact information for the director in your area refer to the director's list in this booklet. The director's roster is subject to change so if you don't find a local contact feel free to get in touch with your regional director or the national director. If you, or an associate, are interested in a SSUSA Clubs & Leagues director's position please contact your local, regional or national administrator to make your intentions known.

Promote Clubs On Website

The SSUSA Clubs & Leagues REGIONS Tab on the SSUSA Home Page on www.seniorsoftball.com provides an excellent opportunity for clubs & leagues to post their essential club/league information. In addition club/league news, stories, statistics, pictures, etc, can be included on this same page. As a matter of standard practice this information will be displayed for all clubs/leagues that obtain SSUSA league insurance.

As a service to senior players, the SSUSA website will list all senior clubs & leagues with basic contact information.

For Clubs & Leagues desiring more promotion, but do not wish to become SSUSA affiliates by purchasing insurance, there is a limited SSUSA affiliation plan available. If a club/league wishes to take advantage of this limited affiliation they will be able to display their essential information on the web site as well as publish news, pictures, etc.

The fee for obtaining the SSUSA limited affiliation is \$15 per team per calendar year. A two team club (\$30) or a 10 team league (\$150) can be represented on the web site without being a SSUSA insurance partner. If the club/league decides later, during the same calendar year, to become insured with the SSUSA, the SSUSA limited affiliation fee would be applied as a credit against the cost of the insurance. For example the 10 team league's insurance payment would be \$275 (the facility fee), plus \$20 per team times 10 teams (the team fee), minus \$150 (the limited affiliation credit), for a total of \$325.

Advertising

Clubs & leagues can expect to see news of their respective regions appear in their regional section or insert of the "Senior Softball News", the SSUSA's quarterly newspaper. The "Senior Softball News" ad rates, for the zoned (regional) sections, are listed in the accompanying table. The person actually selling the ad receives 20 percent of the price of the ad the first time it appears. The salesperson receives 10 percent of the price

of the ad for each additional time it appears. Anyone can act as the salesperson, it is not a role reserved just for SSUSA directors. This is a great fund-raising tool for clubs and leagues.

Umpires

UMPIRING OPTIONS

Paid SSUSA Umpires:

Paid SSUSA umpires receive up to \$25,000 in medical benefits per claim and \$5,000 in accidental death / dismemberment per claim. Paid SSUSA umpires are covered by the SSUSA liability insurance policy.

The annual registration fee for SSUSA umpires is \$35 per person (this is for SSUSA paid umpires only / it is good for the year).

NOTE: The \$35.00 umpire registration fee is for a full registration and all umpires are encouraged to become fully registered. However if this is the only SSUSA event an umpire will work during the season, and it entails a minimum amount of games worked, there is a limited registration fee of \$12.00 that will be accepted, with the approval of the SSUSA National UIC.

Umpire registration fees for paid umpires, accompanied by a completed SSUSA umpire's registration form (a printable blank version of the form is available on the SSUSA web site, www.seniorsoftball.com), should be sent to the SSUSA's National UIC Ray Starwalt, 2307 36th St SE, Puyallup, WA 98374. If you have any umpire questions, Ray Starwalt can be contacted at (W) 253-848-0068; (C) 253-208-2550; or (E) starwaltr@aol.com.

Paid ISA Umpires:

An agreement has been reached between the SSUSA and the ISA whereby registered ISA umpires can work SSUSA events under the terms of their existing ISA umpire's contract. There is no need for the ISA umpires to sign a waiver to work SSUSA events.

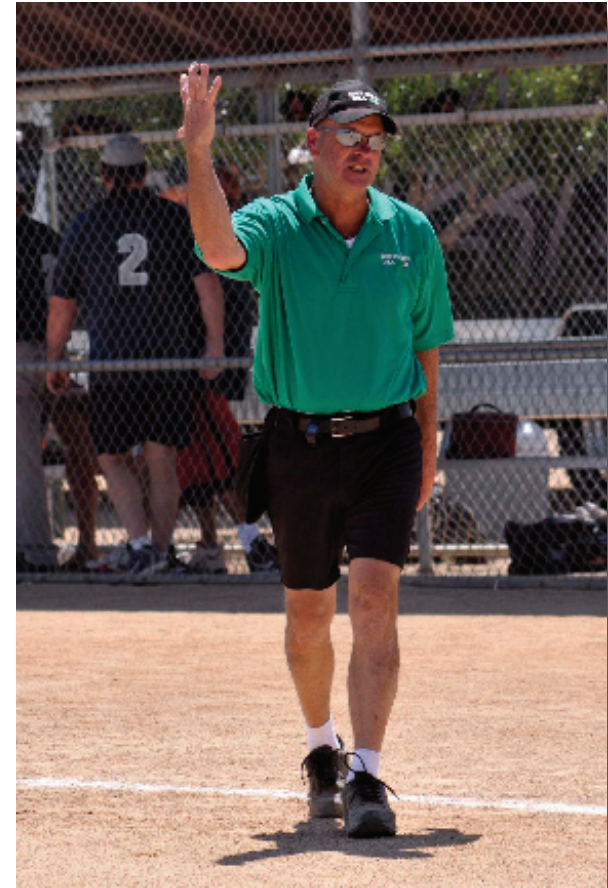
All Other Paid Umpires:

All other paid umpires, who work SSUSA events utilizing their own association's existing umpire's contract, must have an official of their association submit a signed waiver to the SSUSA acknowledging they are working the event under the terms of their own contract. The waiver will

state that the SSUSA and their agents are not held liable for any actions taken against or occurring to the umpires. The waiver will also state that the umpires will honor SSUSA rules and regulations, if applicable, or special league / tournament rules and regulations that vary from their own association's rules and regulations.

Volunteer Unpaid Umpires:

All volunteer unpaid umpires are covered under the general conditions of the SSUSA insurance policy. This includes the liability coverage as well as the secondary medical coverage.



Tournaments

Within this booklet you will find references made to recreational tournaments. Unlike a SSWC tournament (qualifiers, regionals and nationals) which are structured tournaments, played to specific rules, with divisions for defined age brackets and skill levels and well monitored registration procedures for both teams and players, a recreation tournament is pretty much a free form event. The recreation tournament can be anything you want it to be. They will be listed on the www.seniorsoftball.com Recreational Tournament List.

It is recommended that a recreation tournament be designed to allow all skill levels, from Major Plus to the true recreational player, to equally participate and enjoy the event. Teams should be structured in such a manner so the talent is evenly distributed. If there is a discernible difference between some of the teams it may be a good idea to establish a competitive division and a recreational division.

Ideas that have worked include allowing teams to consist of all ages with an even distribution of the age groups, evenly disbursing the stronger skill level players among the participating teams, holding a tournament draft to establish fair teams, using modified playing rules to assist players hindered by physical ailments and encouraging full participation by all players present.

The emphasis of a recreational tournament should be to give the recreational players, those that don't attend sanctioned qualifiers and nationals, a fun tournament experience. You still want the tournament to be competitive but the goal should be that all players participate and all teams have a fair chance of being successful.

For further information regarding recreational tournaments you are encouraged to consult with your local SSUSA Clubs & Leagues director. The SSUSA director will be more than happy to provide information on how to run a recreational tournament. The director will also be available to act as tournament boss if that is the type of help sought by the club / league.

FAQ's

Q. Do you need a SSUSA players card to play in a SSUSA insured recreation league?

A. No. The players card is only needed if you play in a SSWC qualifier or a SSWC regional or national tournament.



Q. Can you use the Miken Ultra II bat in a SSUSA insured recreation league?

A. Yes, providing there is no local league rule against using the bat. All approved SSUSA equipment can be used in a SSUSA insured recreation league. This includes the Miken Ultra II bat as well as all other 1.21 bpf approved bats.

Q. Are league directors covered by the insurance?

A. Yes. League directors that take an active role in the organization and operation of the league are covered. This is regardless of whether or not they play in the league.



Q. Will the SSUSA provide a written copy of the insurance policy?

A. No. It is too voluminous to copy and distribute. The SSUSA, instead, provides an abbreviated summary of the policy, and its terms. That is in the form of certificates of liability insurance, issued by SSUSA's insurance broker, National Certified, Inc, as well as a one page insurance confirmation notice, issued by SSUSA.

Q. Will the insurance cover us on all the fields we use for league play?

A. Yes, providing the information has been made available for each field (name and address) so a certificate of liability insurance can be put in force for each facility.

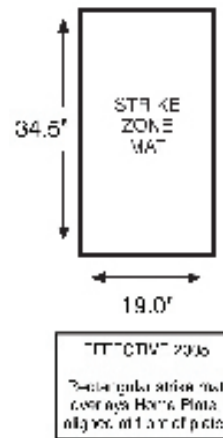
Balls

In 2008, the Official Dimensions of the rubber Strike Mat were changed. The new rectangular mat has measurements of 19" wide and 34½" deep and the mat will be placed over the Home Plate, aligned at the front edge.
