Monday, October 19 (B, D)

Madrid

After breakfast, we will depart for an extensive, full day guided city tour of Madrid, in English. Entrances to the Royal Palace of Madrid, Stadium and the Reina Sofia Museum are included.

The Royal Palace of Madrid belongs to Spain's royal family since it's construction in 1738. King Felipe VI, the current monarch, serves as the commander-in-chief of the armed forces and has regulatory powers in the Parliament. Now operated by Spain's National Heritage agency, the Palace is now used for state ceremonies.

The Reina Sofia (Queen Sofia) Museum houses Spain's 20th century art, including collections from Pablo Picasso and Salvador Dalí. Picasso's famous *Guernica* painting is housed there, which depicts the 1937 bombing of Guernica in Northern Spain by Nazi Germany and Fascist Italy. The bombing, an infamous war crime, bolstered Hitler ally and Spanish fascist dictator, Francisco Franco (1936-1975), to power.

The tour will also feature prominent sightseeing venues such as the Plaza Mayor and Plaza de España, filled with history and beautiful architecture.

Upon completing the tour, our motorcoach will drop us off at the hotel in the late afternoon where a group dinner will be served at our hotel or a local restaurant.

Tuesday, October 20 (B, D)

Madrid

The city of Madrid is so full of rich history and beauty, a one-day city tour is not enough. After breakfast, we embark on an additional half-day city tour of Madrid, in English.

This time, entrance to the Prado and Thyssen-Bornemisza Museums will be covered, as well as the entrance to Las Ventas.

The Prado and Thyssen Museums, along with the Reina Sofia from yesterday, are known as the Golden Triangle of Art in Madrid. The Prado features works as far back as the 12th century, with many of the pieces having belonged to the royal family, while the Thyssen focuses on more modern works across Western Europe and Spain.

Las Ventas is the colosseum famous for bullfighting; were matadors face bulls in front of large audiences. The colosseum was also converted into Franco's personal concentration camp during the Spanish Civil War (1936-1939).

Upon completing the tour, our motorcoach will drop us off at the hotel where the afternoon is yours to plan. A group dinner will be served at the hotel or local restaurant that evening.

After breakfast, we embark on a half-day city tour of Valencia, in English. Spain's third largest

city, Valencia was found in 138 B.C. as a Roman colony, predating the formation of Spain and Islamic rule of the Iberian peninsula.

Entrances to La Lonja (photo left), Miguelete Tower and Mercado Central are included.

La Lonja and Miguelete Tower are popular tourist sites in the city. La Lonja is a Gothic-style building, built in 1533 and was home to most of the regions financial dealings and Spain's first marine merchant court, among other civil processes.

Mercado Central is one of Europe's largest public market, measuring over 86,000 square feet. The market's history dates back to 1839 as an open-air venue for merchants. In the early 20th century, the city held a contest to build a structure to house the large market. The now roofed market is known for its unique architecture.

Lunch is yours to plan after the tour, before returning to the hotel and a free afternoon to explore the city.

For dinner, the motorcoach will transport us from the hotel to a dinner cruise on the coast of Valencia in the Mediterranean Sea. Savor traditional Spanish fare on an evening cruise as we sail along the coast and enjoy views of the city skyline from the

water. Enjoy a traditional paella served with beer and sangria.

After the dinner cruise, we will return to the hotel.

Monday, October 26 (B, D)

Barcelona

After breakfast at our hotel, we embark on a half-day city tour of Barcelona, in English.

Barcelona is the second most populated city in Spain, and one of the more populated regions along the Mediterranean Sea. It's also the capital of Catalonia, an autonomous self-governing

region in Spain. In 2017, growing public sentiment for full independence caused the autonomous government to attempt to secede from Spain. The failed attempt caused Spain to enact temporary direct rule and snap elections in the region to replace those in the government who supported independence. Jailed separatists were later pardoned in 2021.

Entrances to the Sagrada Família and Castillo Montjuïc will be covered, time permitting. The Sagrada Família (photo right), is one of the World's most famous Cathedrals.



Famed architect, Antoni Gaudi, designed the Sagrada Família, which began construction in 1882. It's the Worlds largest unfinished Catholic church.

The Castillo Montjuïc, a 17th century castle that once defended the Catalan region.

After the tour, we return to our hotel where the afternoon is yours to enjoy. The Farewell/Award Dinner will be posted this night at the hotel or local restaurant.
