From the Dugout: Worlds Set Record with 651 Teams – Largest in US

Congratulations to the 35 teams that won the World Championships, the oldest Senior Softball Championships, and now the largest softball tournament in America. Winners received coveted Josten's championship rings – the same rings they make for Major League Baseball and the National Football League.

With 651 teams, many divisions were huge – with the largest being the 50 AAA men with 75 teams! Our sport continues to grow at all levels, setting records for teams in the 40 Masters men and women, the 50 men and women – and at the upper age groups with 16 teams in the 80 division and 5 in the 85 age division.

To put this in perspective, the 651 teams included 26,000 players and family from 46 states, Canada and Guam.

There were highlights – with five inductions into the Nation al Senior Softball Hall of Fame, 22 US National Games and seven teams winning the top award in the sport – the Triple Grand Slam!

The most prestigious award of the year, the Steve Simmons Memorial Sportsmanship Award, went to the 80-year-old Florida Investment Property team.

There was also tragedy: Ron Smith from the 65AAA Excessive Force (CA) team suffered a heart attack on the field. He was resuscitated on the field, but died later in the hospital.

Four teams dropped out shortly before they were scheduled to play because of positive COVID tests in the teams.

We'd also like to thank the players and teams for their patience with the new world of sports amid the pandemic: no community water jugs in the dugouts,

Final Session of The Worlds Sees Two Teams Complete Triple Grand Slam



LAS VEGAS – The largest softball tournament in America, the Senior Softball World Championships, concluded here with the IV and Women's 50s age divisions playing in the fourth and final session, Sept. 30 – Oct. 3.

The four sessions of the tournament drew 651 teams.

Session four featured 156 teams, scheduled to play in 513 games.

Champions came from five states: Florida, Connecticut, Texas, California and Maryland, and the U.S. territory of Guam.

- Old School (CA) and Lew's Crew/Exceeding Expectations (MD) complete elusive Triple Grand Slam in the Women's 50 Major and AAA Divisions, respectively.
- Two deaf teams, Leftovers (AZ) and Deaf Nation Senior Softball (MI), compete in the Men's 50 AAA Division.

no manager meetings and mask mandates indoors.

In addition, we lost two 4-field softball complexes this year. The artificial-turf fields were condemned by Clark County, which is in the process of replacing the turf. The loss of the fields resulted in us using more 2- and 3-field complexes than normal. We expect those fields under repair to be available by next year's Worlds.

And, of course, the bottom line is that we hope players enjoyed their time at the tournament and in Las Vegas – that is the point of it all!

In the 11-team Men's 50 Major Plus Division, Bay Equity/Hara's/Vortex (WA) took the top seed in the bracket, following their 32-1 win over J.K. Inc/GTL (CA) in the U.S. National Championship Game.

Going 1-2 in bracket play, Bay Equity/Hara's/Vortex fell short of the Triple Grand Slam.

Following a 2-0 record in seeding play, Suncoast/Adidas (FL) continued their winning ways in bracket, going 4-0 to complete a perfect weekend, capped off by a 30-8 win over Fattboyz/Prestige/Elite (CA) in the championship game.

FBI/Worth/Miken (FL) won four straight games in the elimination side of the bracket en route to their eventual third place finish.

The complete 2022 SSUSA schedule will be released in the coming months as we secure fields and dates with our partner cities.

Men's 50 Major (46 Teams)



Hard Hat Cafe/Latella's (CT) - Men's 50 Major World Champs

The 46-team Men's 50 Major Division featured a three-team playoff for the U.S. National Championship that included Freehold Buick GMC/Juno Athletics (NJ), G.O. Softball Junkies/WEPNZ/Dss (CA) and Hard Hat Café/Latella's (CT).

With a 23-22 win over Freehold Buick GMC/Juno Athletics and a 20-19 win over Hard Hat Café/Latella's, G.O. Softball Junkies/WEPNZ/DSS took home the U.S. National Championship.

G.O. Softball Junkies/WEPNZ/Dss fell short of the overall Triple Grand Slam, as the team was eliminated Saturday evening.

The U.S. National runner-up, following its 22-19 win over Freehold Buick GMC/Juno Athletics, Hard Hat Café/Latella's rolled through bracket play with a perfect 6-0 record, including a 21-4 win over HTM (ID) in the championship game.

Bart's Fossils/BL29Sports (CA) finished in third place, while Arizona Heat rounded out the top four finishers.

50 Degrees (MO) and Utility Systems C & E (MD) tied for fifth place.

Men's 50 AAA (75 Teams)

The largest division of the entire World Championships was the massive 75-team Men's 50 AAA Division.

In the U.S. National Championship Game, CaliGold (CA) knocked off High Street Bucs (MD), 16-13.

CaliGold would fall short of the Triple Grand Slam, as the team failed to advance to Championship Sunday.

Overall, 12 teams advanced to the final day of play, four of which with undefeated records in bracket play: Alpha Dawg/Dayton Legends (OH), Oklahoma Rhino, Originals (TX), and High Street Bucs.

Of the four, Originals would go on to complete gauntlet unscathed, going 7-0 in bracket play, including a thrilling 24-23 win over High Street Bucs in the championship game.

Lonestar (TX) won four straight games on Sunday en route to their third place finish, while Oklahoma Rhino rounded out the top four finishers.

Alpha Dawg/Dayton Legends and Smash It Sports Northwest (WA) tied for fifth place, while Old Skool/GTS Sports (PA) and The Persuaders (KS) tied for seventh place.

The Senior Softball World Championships in Las Vegas was a record-setter in 2021. 644 teams, representing 40 states (including the U.S. Territory of Guam), and two Canadian provinces, competed on the field across nine complexes in 35 divisions. 2022 Tournament of Champions



POLK COUNTY, Fla. - The Crown Jewel of Senior Softball enters its 16th year here in 2022, pitting the best of the best on the softball diamonds.

There simply is no other tournament in the sport that comes close to the SSUSA Original Tournament of Champions: Free rings for winners, special edition bats for MVPs, gift bags for every manager, a gala sit-down banquet for 1,500 players and their families – and that does not even include the hitting clinics, skills contests and the All-Star Game!

This year's tournament will be held February 9 - 13 and only winners of qualifying tournament are invited. In short, it's the tournament for champions, only. Second-place teams stay home. This is the original Tournament of Champions and it's only for those teams that have been previously crowned king of the hill at a Senior Softball USA sanctioned tournament during the 2021 season. Due to the pandemic that limited many of the annual events at the 2021 TOC, those teams that participated in the 2021 TOC will also be extended an invitation to the 2022 TOC.

"The TOC here offers the most elite event in the sport to celebrate winners of the top tournaments in the country," said Terry Hennessy, chief executive officer of SSUSA. "No one offers a tournament that even comes close."

"It's a battle of tournament champions taking on tournament champions to determine which team is truly the top team of the year," he said. "There's really nothing like it and that's why teams go all out to come back each year."

The Tournament of Champions handsomely rewards its winners who received free championship rings and each player earns a TOC certificate. In addition, the most valuable players in each division win a bat.
