Death is no stranger to those of us in Senior Softball.

Happily, we celebrate life every time we play.

CARMICHAEL, Calif. - John "Jack" Kocunik, 72, of the Sacramento Islanders 70s, slid into home base on July 17, 2021. Jack died of COVID-19. He had been vaccinated, but a medical treatment undermined the effectiveness of the vaccine and he succumbed to the illness.

Born in Syracuse, N.Y, Jack was an avid New York Yankees fan. He is preceded in death by his parents, John D. and Jane Kocunik. He was a graduate of Le Moyne College accounting program. He served as chief financial officer of Schools Financial Credit Union from 1978 until his retirement in 2011.

Jack's love of his family and his friends was only matched by his love of baseball and softball. He loved to spoil his children and grandchildren, and many knew him for his legendary generosity.

HEMET, Calif. - The 2021 Southern California State Championships took place here at Diamond Valley Lake Sports Complex, June 22-27, with 81 teams in action.

Due to the increase in the number of teams registering for the tournament (specifically in the second session) and the inability to secure a second complex in order to host all teams, the Men' Division, which featured 14 teams, was not held.

The tournament began with 27 teams playing in the Men's 65 to 85 age divisions.

In the three-team Men's 65 Platinum Division, top seed Top Gun Elite (CA) took first place, with D & K (CA) finishing second. West Coast All-Stars (CA) rounded out the division.

D & K defeated Top Gun Elite, 11-3, in the championship game to force the "if" game. However, the team forfeited the decisive game.

In the five-team Men's 65/70 Gold Division, Las Vegas Heat 70 downed top seed Weakened Warriors (CA), 25-22, in the championship game.

After dropping their first bracket game, 14-13, against No Guts, No Glory (CA), Weakened Warriors won back-to-back elimination games en route to their runner-up finish.

No Guts, No Glory finished in third place.

911 Softball Club (CA) and Lights Out (CA) played a best-of-three game series in the Men's 65 AA Division.

911 Softball Club took the opening game 19-9, while Lights Out returned the favor with a 17-8 victory in game two.

In the rubber match, Lights Out completed the comeback with a 21-12 win to take home the title.

In the six-team Men's 70 AAA Division, SoCal Gusto upset top seed D & K Softball (CA) 20-19 in the championship game, forcing the "if" game. However, the game would not be played, with \$ Gusto forfeiting to D & K.

Top Gun Patriots (CA) finished in third place after winning a pair of elimination games.

Tharaldson's 75 (NV) swept Top Gun 80 Gold (CA) in a best of three series for the Men's 75/80 Gold Division, by scores of 13-7 and 10-1, respectively.

2021 Quad City Classic Plays Host to 43 teams

ROCK ISLAND, III. --- The 2021 Quad Cities Classic started out and ended up with nothing but sunshine, but featured a heavy mix of 2-3 inches of rain throughout the rest of the week. As always in Rock Island, the grounds crew worked overtime and again were up for the challenge.

In the 75M / AAA, Midwest Express of lowa took home championship hardware averaging 25 runs per game and going undefeated at 5-0. Chicago Gray Sox finished second at 4-1 with their only loss coming to the Midwest Express.

The 70 Major Division featured a best-of-three game series between Chicago Strikers and Minnesota Masters. Minnesota Masters took game one 18-14, but the Strikers came back with big open innings in both games to defeat Masters 19-14 and 17-11.

The 70 AAA Division saw the Oshkosh Ambassadors go undefeated at 5-0 averaging 24 runs per game. Midstate Seniors finished in second place at 3-2.

St. Louis Vision/Aces were winners in two straight games 22-7 and 16-10 to defeat Badger Classics for the

In the five-team 70/75 Silver Division, top seed Top Gun 6 Bits 75 (CA) dropped their opening bracket game, 15-6, against Southern California Crush.

Top Gun 6 Bits would then regroup in the elimination side of the bracket with four-straight victories, including a double-dip over J Squared (CA). The No. 1 seed eked out a 15-14 win in the championship game, and then a 16-6 win in the "if" game.

Southern California Crush finished in third place.

In the four-team Men's 80/85 Gold Division, the top two seeds squared off in the championship game, with Scorpions 80 (AZ) knocking off Top Gun Blue Angels, 7-5.

Top Gun Diamonds finished in third place.

The tournament continued with the Men's 40 to 55 age divisions and Women's 40 to 50 age divisions taking the field on June 25. 54 teams competed over the weekend.

Starting with the three-team Women's 40 Major Division, HTS-Here To Smash (CA) posted a perfect 3-0 record in bracket play, including a 19-18 win over top seed Hafta Play (CA) in the championship game.

Broken Dollz (CA) rounded out the division.

In the five-team Women's 40/50 Gold Division, top seed Stix With Impact 50 (CA) avenged their 15-7 loss in the championship game against Old School 50 (CA), with an 18-4 win in the "if" gar

Pro Moves 40 (CA) finished in third place. As the highest finishing 40 AAA team, Pro Moves earns a TOC berth for their respective division.

The Men's 40 Division featured 17 teams, with three teams in the Major Plus division, 12 teams in the Major division, and two in the AAA division.

Starting with the Major Plus Division, top seed Fattboyz/Elite (CA) completed a perfect weekend, capped off by a 17-4 win over Onyx (CA) in the championship game.

Flawless/Loaded Sports (CA) rounded out the division.

In the Major Division, Flatliners (CA) completed an undefeated weekend, going 2-0 in seeding to earn the No. 2 seed, and continued their run in bracket play, going 4-0, including a 23-14 win c Pony Tail Express (CA) in the championship game.

To end the day, Bucks Run Farms scored 8 runs in the open inning to defeat second place Oshkosh of Wisconsin 23-19 to claim 60 Major/AAA Championship. Chicago Panthers finished in third place due to a loss to Oshkosh 21-15.

The third session of the Quad City Classic saw 16 teams battling in bracket play for hardware in four divisions.

In the five-team AAA division, Team Illinois posted an undefeated weekend which included a 23-18 win over J&J of Iowa in the championship game. Minnesota Lumberiacks finished in third place.

The four-team 55 Major Division saw the top two seeds battle it out at the end. Aurora Tap House lost their first game in bracket play and fought back to face the lowa Demons in the first championship game. Averaging 24 runs a game and scoring the maximum runs in the first five innings became too much for Aurora Tap House to overcome. A perfect 4-0 weekend for the Demons was capped off with a 25-10 victory. St. Louis Shockers finished in third place.

The final two champions would be decided in 50 AAA and 50 Major. The three-team AAA division saw round robin play conclude with a single elimination on Sunday. Iowa Demons defeated Milwaukee's Best 14-13 and All In Softball of Oak Forest, Ill., defeated the lowa Demons 20-10 in a winner-take-all championship game. All In would finish the weekend at 3-1.

Two familiar foes from Illinois squared off in 50 Major with Big Hurt Softball winning 22-21 scoring three runs in the open inning to overcome a 10 run top of the seventh inning by CT Vipers. Vipers defeated lowa Demons 20-17 and Maher Homes of Nebraska 17-16 in loser's bracket. Big Hurt playing their first game on

Pony Tail Express had won three straight elimination games to reach the championship game.

Howarth Construction (CA) finished in third place, while RLG Legacy (CA) finished fourth.

The best-of-three game series in the AAA Division between Aces (AZ) and Skrewballs (CA) went the distance.

In the opener, Skrewballs got on the board first, taking game one 17-16. Aces evened up the series with a 24-12 win in game two, forcing the deciding game.

Skrewballs took the rubber-match, 18-12, to claim the championship.

In the six-team Men's 50 Platinum Division, top seed Scrap Iron/Elite (CO) posted a flawless weekend, going 2-0 in seeding, and 3-0 in bracket play, including a 25-20 win over Juiced Up Athle (CA) in the championship game.

Juiced Up Athletics survived the elimination side of the bracket with three straight wins to secure its eventual spot in the championship game.

Bad Attitude (CA) was the third place finisher.

In the seven-team Men's 50 AAA Division, top seed Lokahi AZ dropped the championship game, 11-7, against Alliance/Scrap Iron (CO), before re-grouping with a 19-3 win in the "if" game.

Alliance/Scrap Iron entered into bracket play as the No. 2 seed, following 2-0 record in seeding. However, the team got off to rough start in bracket, dropping their first two games. The team we eventually right the ship, winning three straight games, including the championship game, before running out of steam in the "if" game.

Viejos So Cal finished in third place.

In the six-team Men's 55 Major Division, No. 1 seed So Cal 55 took top honors, going 3-0 in bracket play, including a win over Team Rawlings (CA) in the championship game.

Team Rawlings had won three straight games in the elimination side of the bracket to reach the championship game. However, they would have to forfeit the final game due to injury.

So Cal Guys 55 finished in third place.

In the 11-team Men's 55 AAA Division, No. 7 seed Alliance/Scrap Iron (CO) went 5-0 in bracket play, including a 22-18 win over Enforcers (CA) in the championship game.

After dropping their opening game of the bracket, 21-15, against Alliance/Scrap Iron, Enforcers rattled off five straight wins to reach the championship game.

No. 1 seed Top Gun Phantoms (CA) finished in third place.

Following back-to-back loses to open bracket play, Top Gun Growlers (CA) won three straight games en route to their fourth-place finish.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - The 13th annual Northeast Championships attracted 54 teams from eight states here July 6-11.

Rain showers shortened the first day of both sessions of the tournament, on Tuesday and Friday.

"On Tuesday, we played two rounds and had to cancel the rest of the day," said Tournament Director Gayle Collins. "We reworked the schedule so if it (rain) happened again we would have win each division."

As a result, the first session (65-80 divisions) lost only one seeding game and the second session (40-60) didn't lose any games because directors used shortened game times on Friday.

The oldest division, 75 / 80 AAA, had four 75 AAA teams and one 80 AAA. The Long Island Jaguars 75s of New York won the division in thrilling fashion, beating the Bostonian 75s of Massachusetts 17-16 in the Championship game.

The teams tied 9-9 in the fourth inning, then tied again 11-11 in the fifth. The Jaguars pulled ahead 15-13 in the sixth inning and Bostonians pushed to a 16-15 lead in the top of the seventh inr Jaguars came back with the two runs they needed in the bottom of the inning to win the game and the championships.

Syracuse Cyclones 75s came in third.

The 65/70 Gold Division was a mix of 10 teams that played blended pool games, then broke into three sets of finals.

In the 65 Major playoffs, Promotion of New Jersey defeated Deep Purple of Massachusetts 15-10 in the championships game to win. Deep Purple advanced from the elimination bracket to the game by beating New Jersey Hitmen, who came in third place, 10-9.

In the 65 AAA Division, Talaga Construction of Connecticut defeated Cellular Sales of New York 21-12, then beat the Rochester (NY) Royals 19-6 to advance to the championship game agains Cellular. In the finals, Cellular, in its fourth game of the bracket, ran out of steam and Talaga prevailed 32-13 to win the division.

The Rochester Royals took third.

In the 65/70 Silver Division, with two 70AAA and one 65 AA, it was a battle of Syracuse Cyclones for the title. The Cyclones 70s advanced to the finals after beating the Rochester Royals 70s bracket play and faced their young brothers – the Cyclones 65s. The Cyclone 70s took the lead early in the game and never lost it, defeating the Cyclone 65s 13-8.

In the second session of the Northeast Championships, the Roosters of New York pounded through the large 10-team 40s division with lopsided seeding scores (20-4 and 18-4), before skating through the bracket with four straight wins. In close competition in the 55 AAA division finals, the 55 Finance of America team of New Jersey double-dipped Syracuse Crunch of New York 19-16 and 21-20 to win the championships. In a earlier bracket game, Finance edged the Crunch 18-17 on its path to victory.

ERB Financial of New York was third place.

There was another double-dip in the 55/60 Platinum Division, with three 55 Majors and one 60 Major-Plus team. Building Innovation Group 55s emerged from the elimination bracket to beat fe New Yorkers, Buell Fuel 55s, 17-12 and 15-11 for the title. Buell had knocked Building Innovation into the elimination bracket in the first game.

Bond 124/OSS/Phil's Painting of Massachusetts took third place.

In the 60 Major Division, Action Auto Parts of Rhode Island won in a series of low-run games after defeating all three other Major teams in seeding play. Action Auto beat Olympian Athletics of Pennsylvania 8-3, then Pittsburgh North 10-8, before facing Olympian again in the finals. Action Auto continued its streak, defeating Olympian 14-5 for the title.

Pittsburgh North came in third.

In the 60 AAA Division, Ockers Company of Massachusetts won two of its three bracket games by one run on its way to the title. Ockers beat the Syracuse Cyclones 16-15, then Northeast Jackhammers of New York twice: 21-6 and scoring 4 runs in the bottom of the seventh to win 13-12 in the Championship game.

2021 SSUSA Convention

The 2021 SSUSA National Convention will take place Monday, November 29 - Thursday, December 2, in SSUSA's home city of Sacramento, Calif.



Fortunately, enough games were played the first two days of the tournament to determine winners in the six divisions that competed.

The six winners came from five different states, with two winners from Indiana and one each from Tennessee, Illinois, Alabama and Missouri. The 28 teams came from nine states – as far awa Arizona.

In the 50 Major Division, 615 Honored/Sumner from Tennessee ran the table with five straight wins. 615 Honored went 3-0 in the seeding games, beating all three of the other Major teams in t bracket, before beating Connecticut Vipers 17-10 in the first bracket game and then KB 50's/ Huey Designs from Kentucky in the semifinals to become the only unbeaten team in the bracket are winning the championships.

KB 50's took second place and Walker Brothers from Alabama came in third in the 50 Major Division.

In the four-team 50 AAA Division, Dudley Lightning of Illinois also posted a perfect weekend record of 5-0 to win the division. Dudley also beat each team in the division in the seeding rounds top seed. In bracket play, Dudley edged the No. 4 seed, Our Dirt from Indiana 20-19 and then handily beat 615 Senior Softball of Tennessee in the semifinals to take the division.
