From the Dugout: New Rituals

Returning from the recent World Masters Championships (WMC) last Monday, resulted in a new pandemic ritual for me – and many other players.

Five days of quarantine, then a COVID-19 test, which, thank goodness, was negative.

The quarantine wasn't bad on my five-acre "mini-farm" in the foothills in Northern California. At least it hadn't burned when I was away.

Yes, it has been that kind of year.

Still, we have much for which to be thankful.

Consider that 315 teams and almost 10,000 players, spectators and

2020 World Masters Field Shakeup for Session 4; Papago Park Added



The <u>2020 LVSSA/SSUSA World Masters Championships</u> (WMC) will resume in three weeks with the fourth and fina session, the Men's and Women's 50's Divisions, playing October 29 – November 1 in the Phoenix Metro area.

Recently, SSUSA was informed by the City of Mesa that field availability for Thursday, Friday and Sunday during the fourth session of the World Masters Championships would be significantly reduced.

These reductions have forced us to relocate divisions.

To solve the shortfall, we have added Papago Park Softbal

officials participated in the WMC over the first three sessions and fewer than 20 have so far reported contracting COVID-19. Only one case has required hospitalization and that player thankfully is being released this week.

We will continue to monitor any players who contract COVID-19 and we will publish the team age, where the team came from, and its skill level so that other teams in the same age/skill level will be aware. We will continue to strongly recommend that any players in the same age and skill level get tested as soon as possible to stop any potential spread.

We do not publicize the team names or the names of players who have tested positive to protect their privacy, however, we will continue to be as transparent as possible and update any new cases.

Like many of you, I take a chance when I play or go to a tournament. In fact, I'm forcefully reminded of the risks every time from my daughter, who is a nurse practitioner.

The risks are real and we respect those who have decided to sit out the year because of concerns of loved ones who may be at higher risk.

For those of us who do decide to play, we believe – strongly – that face masks work.

This is not political.

We simply want to ensure that anyone attending a tournament cuts down on the risk of contracting COVID-19. And that means masks in places where people congregate and it also means moving spectators out of those central areas.

Like all of you, we wish this was over. Until then, please know that we will do our best to protect those who decide to play.

I look forward to seeing you on the field.

COVID Cases Update

SACRAMENTO – Seventeen people on seven different teams have reported positive COVID-19 tests in the first session (55/60 men) of the 2020 LVSSA/SSUSA World Masters Championships (WMC). Three cases have been reported in the second session (65-85 men) and no cases in the third session (40 Masters men and women). Only one of the cases has required hospitalization.

The first three sessions of the WMC attracted 315 teams and almost 10,000 players and their families.

The cases reported include:

Two players and a friend from a 60AA Colorado team.

Coach of a 60 AA Oklahoma team.

A pitcher from a 60AA team from Nevada.

A player from a 60 Major team from Minnesota. A player, his wife, and daughter from a 55AAA Southern California team.

Seven players and the coach of a 55 and 60 Major-Plus teams from Texas. The initial player became ill on the second day of play. That player is being hospitalized with pneumonia.

A player from a 65 Major team from Nevada.

A player from a 65 Major-Plus team from California.

Complex in Phoenix for Thursday and Friday (it is no available on the weekend).

In addition, Victory Lane Sports Complex agreed to postpone its leagues and open all six (6) fields up from Thursday- Sunday. This change allowed us to move the 50-team Men's 50 AAA Division to Victory Lane.

However, the Men's 50 AAA Division filled Victory Lane, so we had to move the Men's 50 Major Plus and 50 AA, and the Women's Divisions to Mesa on Friday-Sunday.

We apologize for the change and thank you in advance for your understanding during these difficult times... especially because we already had to move the WMC 50 Divisions to both a different city and different dates.

- Men's 50 Major-Plus: Skyline (Mesa) Fri. & Sat. / Eastmark (Mesa) Sun.
- Men's 50 Major: Eastmark (Mesa) Thur. thru Sun. / Papago (Phoenix) Thur. & Fri. / Skyline (Mesa) Sat.
- Men's 50 AAA: Victory Lane (Glendale) Thur. thru Sun.
- Men's 50 AA: Papago (Phoenix) Fri. / Eastmark (Mesa) Sat. / Skyline (Mesa) Sun.
- Women's 50 Major: Skyline (Mesa) Fri. thru Sun.
- Women's 50 AAA: Skyline (Mesa) Fri. and Sun. / Eastmark (Mesa) Sat.


