Fast Reaction Saves Umpire's Life

PHOENIX – Quick action by a Senior Softball director, player and spectator saved the life of SSUSA Umpire Tracy Farmer, who collapsed with a heart attack and stopped breathing during the 50 Major division World Championships here last weekend.

Tracy Farmer was officiating a 50 Major game and walking toward the third base dugout at Papago Park when he collapsed.

Immediately calls for 911 went out, and SSUSA Director Mike Hula and Umpire in Charge Bill Medved converged on the scene with the defibrillator and first aid

pack.

Donnie Hudson, a player from the Stadium team from California was talking to and attempting to confirm that Farmer was still breathing, and aware of his surroundings. Wendy Smith, at the tournament with Lighthouse Lookouts from Georgia, was helping Hudson.

Hula took charge.

"I began by verifying with Donnie that Tracy had an open airway and then began checking for a pulse in the carotid artery and I found it to be weak, but still pulsing," said Hula. "However, within 10 to15 seconds Tracy's started to convulse, his eyes rolled back and his breathing stopped and I lost the pulse."

"We removed his upper body clothing and Donnie started CPR while, I took the defibrillator and began to open up the pads and place them in the proper positions, then we waited for the machine to verify the need to shock, cleared everyone near Tracy, and I applied the current to restart Tracy's heart," said Hula. "After the initial shock, and within a few seconds he opened his eyes and took a deep breath.

"Donnie and I talked with him to confirm he was better and waited there till the EMTs arrived," said Hula.

Tracy Farmer had surgery a few days later and on Wednesday flew home with his son to Tumwater, Wash.



(SSWC) officially concluded here in Glendale and Mesa, Oct. 29 – Nov. 1, with the Men's and Women's 50s Divisions playing in the fourth and final session.

A total of 107 teams representing 28 states competed across six divisions.

The fourth session was highlighted by two U.S. National Championship games, as well as Old School (CA) capturing the Triple Grand Slam title in the Women's 50 Major Division.

For Old School, this marks the team's third straight Triple Grand Slam crown.

Due to the pandemic that forced the relocation of the tournament, the 2020 SSWC was held in six cities in two states (St. George and Santa Clara, UT, and Kingman, Glendale, Mesa and Phoenix, AZ). Overall, 422 teams played over 1,350 games on 10 complexes.

The Men's 50 Major and AAA Divisions began the final session on Oct. 29.

Men's 50 Major (40 Teams)

The 40-team Men's 50 Major Division featured a U.S. National Game, as Hard Hat Café/Latella's (CT) downed Battleborn/Asurea (NV), 30-18.

Completing step two of the Triple Grand Slam, Hard Hat Café/Latella's fell short of the trifecta, going 2-2 in bracket play, being eliminated on Saturday.

Two teams reached Championship Sunday unscathed and in the driver's seat, as Stadium (CA) and CPD/Ancell (MN) each won their first four bracket games to advance to the final day. CPD/Ancell knocked off Stadium 22-19 to punch its ticket into the championship game.

Eight teams in total played on the final day, as Miken Franchise (MO), Hitters Inc (VA), Hara's/SIS (OR), Battleborn/Asurea, Walker Brothers (AL), and Lighthouse Lookouts/Athletic Shop (GA) rounded out the other six.

Hitters Inc made a strong push through the elimination side of the bracket, winning four straight games, including a 21-18 win over CPD/Ancell in the championship game, forcing the decisive "if" game.

COVID Cases Update – Session 4 SSWC

SACRAMENTO – SSUSA was recently informed of four positive cases of COVID-19 from session four of the Senior Softball World Championships.

The positive cases came from two teams - a Men's 50 AAA team from Massachusetts and a Men's 50 Major Plus team from Florida.

Overall, there have been 29 reported positive cases across all four sessions of the 2020 SSWC, which attracted 422 teams and almost 10,000 players and family members.

Along with the recent four cases from session four, the other reported cases from the previous three sessions included:

- Two players and a friend from a 60AA Colorado team.
- Five members of a 60 AA Oklahoma team.
- A pitcher from a 60AA team from Nevada.
- A player from a 60 Major team from Minnesota.
- A player, his wife, and daughter from a 55AAA Southern California team.
- Seven players and the coach of 55 and 60 Major-Plus teams from Texas. The initial player became ill on the second

In the final game, CPD/Ancel avoided the dreaded double-dip, winning the "if" game, 24-20.

Stadium finished in third place, while Hara's/SIS rounded out the top four teams.

Miken Franchise and Lighthouse Lookouts/Athletic Shop tied for fifth.

In the 47-team Men's 50 AAA Division, Daytona Beach Boyz (FL) defeated 805's PE Class (CA) 19-12 in the U.S. National Championship Game.

The Daytona Beach Boyz would eventually fall short of the overall Triple Grand Slam, finishing in a tie for fifth place.

On the final day of play, four teams reached Championship Sunday with unblemished records – Senior Dogs (MO), Scrap Iron Mile High Hitmen (CO), KIKU Imports/MY Buddies (MA) and Arizona Old School.

Eight teams overall reached the final day of play, as the U.S. National Game participants, Daytona Beach Boyz and 805's PE Class, along with Bad Attitude (CA), and Viejos So Cal (CA) rounded out the elimination side of the bracket.

Of the four unbeatens, KIKU Imports/MY Buddies continued their run, going 3-0 on Sunday, including a thrilling 16-15 win over Scrap Iron Mile High Hitmen in the Championship game.

"Charlie was a leader, a real fireball, always gave 110%, a true winner," said Mike Armstrong, manager of OKC RedHawks. "You won't encounter people like Charlie, and his wife Lisa but few times in your life!"

Thigpen tallied a 32 year a career with the United States Postal Service, holding the title of US Postal Inspector for the majority of his career.

Additionally, Thigpen spent 36 years in the United States Air Force. Colonel Thigpen served in Operation Desert Storm in 1990.

Thigpen graduated with his undergraduate degree from the University of Central Oklahoma in 1988. Following his bachelor's degree, Colonel Thigpen graduated with a master's degree in criminal justice from the University of Central Oklahoma in 1996.

Overall, KIKU Imports/MY Buddies polished off a perfect tournament, going 2-0 in seeding and 6-0 in bracket play.

805 PE Class was the third place finisher, while Senior Dogs finished in fourth place.

Along with Daytona Beach Boyz, Arizona Old School was the other fifth place finisher.

Honorable mention goes to Viejos So Cal, who got off on the wrong foot, but was able to right the ship and get into the elite eight.

The team began the tournament going 0-2 in seeding, and then 0-2 to start off bracket play.

Facing elimination in their third game of the bracket, Viejos So Cal rattled off five straight wins, before eventually being eliminated on Sunday by 805's PE Class.

The Men's 50 Major Plus and AA Divisions, and Women's 50s Divisions began play on Oct. 30.

East Bests West, 10-4, in U.S. National Championship Games

Fourteen U.S. National Championship Games were held during the 2020 Senior Softball World Championships (SSWC).

The U.S. National Championship Game is the second leg of the Triple Grand Slam and takes place during seeding play at the SSWC, pitting the winners of the Eastern National Championships against the winners of the Western National Championships.

The Triple Grand Slam consists of winning the Eastern/Western National Championship, the U.S. National Championship Game, and the World Championship.

Because the U.S. National Game is a guaranteed seveninning game, the winner earns the top seed in bracket play, while the loser takes the second seed.

Overall, teams from the East held a commanding 10-4 advantage over their Western counterparts in the games in 2020.
