DALLAS ARTS DISTRICT

The Dallas Arts District is the largest contiguous urban arts district in the nation, spanning 68 acres and 19 blocks. This walkable district is home to some of Dallas' most significant cultural landmarks, museums and performing arts venues, including the multi-venue AT&T Performing Arts Center, Dallas Museum of Art, Nasher Sculpture Center, Crow Museum of Asian Art, Meyerson Symphony Center and Moody Performance Hall. WYLY THEATRE

The compact, vertical orientation of the Wyly Theatre, climbing 12 stories into the Dallas skyline, was designed by Joshua Prince-Ramus of REX and Rem Koolhaas of the Office for Metropolitan Architecture. The theater is located in the Dallas Arts District and home to the Dallas Theater Center, Dallas Black Dance Theatre and the Anita N. Martinez Ballet Folklorico.

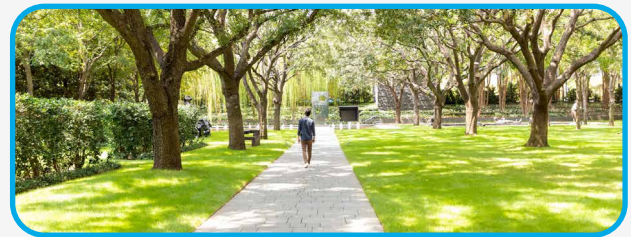

NASHER SCULPTURE CENTER

The longtime dream of the late Raymond and Patsy Nasher, the Nasher Sculpture Center is one of the finest collections of modern and contemporary sculptures in the world. CROW MUSEUM OF ASIAN ART

Part of the Dallas Arts District, the Crow Museum of Asian Art is one of only a handful of museums in the country dedicated solely to the arts and cultures of Japan, China, India and Southeast Asia. Experience a peaceful world of beauty and spirituality in the heart of the city with pieces from 3500 B.C. to the early 20th century. Don't miss a glimpse at precious jade ornaments from China, delicate Japanese scrolls and a rarely seen sandstone facade of an 18th century Indian residence.

PIONEER PLAZA

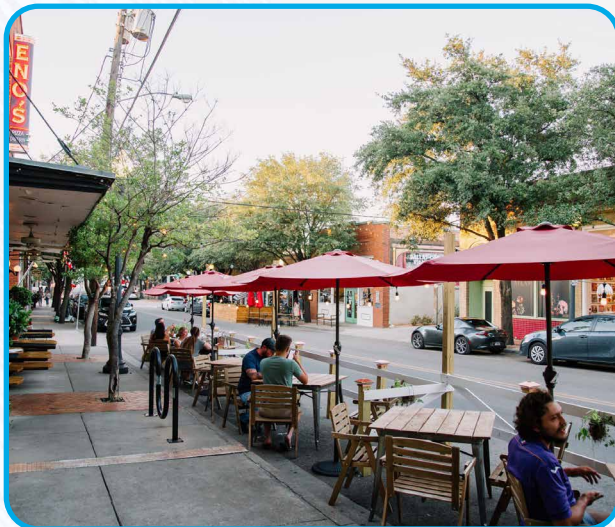
